Process

Compile your work

1. **Create a folder in your Google Drive and organize your artifacts for each category in that folder.**
2. **Organize your service hours in a spreadsheet or on paper with supervisor signatures**
3. **Record your service hours using the CSL QR Code for your grade. Follow directions to email your counselor when you have recorded 75 hours to have the CSL credit awarded.**

Make an appointment

1. **Set up a time with your 2nd hour teacher to review your finished portfolio.**
2. **Your teacher will sign your rubric form to certify completeness.**

Turn in your application & present your portfolio

1. **Rubric + completed forms = application**
2. **Turn in by March 31 in room 1182, the office, or to lisa.cassidy@rps30.k12.ar.us**
3. **Senior presentation**
 - a. **Week of April 12**
 - b. **Instructions in Google Classroom**
 - c. **This step is required**

FAQ

- **CAN I DOUBLE DIP ON CREDENTIALS?**

- **DO I HAVE TO DO EVERY ACTIVITY ON THE CREDENTIAL PAGES TO QUALIFY?**

- No, those are suggestions. You do have to check all the boxes on the rubric/checklist page.

- **DOES MY GPA COUNT FOR CONTENT KNOWLEDGE?**

- No, but standardized test scores do.

- **CAN I USE WORK FROM LAST YEAR?**

- Yes
