

## COVID-19 Fully Vaccinated Definition

The definition of fully vaccinated now involves a booster shot for those individuals who are 18 years of age or older. Individuals in this age group lose fully vaccinated status per the time chart below. Failure to get the booster shot after the noted time period for each brand will result in individuals having to quarantine if they are an identified close contact to a positive person.

For individuals 18 years of age and older:

Brand	When are you fully vaccinated after your first vaccination series?	When to get booster shot to remain fully vaccinated (fully vaccinated once you receive the booster - no waiting period)
Pfizer	Two weeks after the second dose of the two shot series.	Five months after the last two shot dose.
Moderna	Two weeks after the second dose of the two shot series.	Six months after the last two shot dose.
Johnson & Johnson	Two weeks after the original one shot dose.	Two months after the last dose.

The definition of fully vaccinated individuals who are 5-17 years of age or older has not changed.

For individuals 5 to 17 years of age:

Brand	When are you fully vaccinated after your first vaccination series?	No booster required at this point to remain fully vaccinated.
Pfizer	Two weeks after the second dose of the two shot series.	NA
Moderna	Two weeks after the second dose of the two shot series.	NA
Johnson & Johnson	Two weeks after the original one shot dose.	NA
